What is a Vacation Bible School? As I mentioned last week in my homily, so many of the children in our communities have never heard of Jesus before, let alone been to Church! A Vacation Bible School (or VBS, for short) is a free day camp for kids to be able to learn a bit about Jesus and the life of the Church. Sometimes a VBS has a particular theme that helps to guide the week and tell the stories, but that is not always the case. It is a “vacation” because it gets the kids out of the house, there are Bible stories, and there is learning – hence the word “school”. But don’t be fooled, VBS is not just like school, but is more of a camp!

As has been published in the parish bulletins for the last couple weeks, St. Mary’s (with support from the Parish of Marysville) will be hosting a Vacation Bible School (VBS) at St. Mary’s from **August 8th to 12th**. The target age range are children entering grade 1 through grade 6 this coming September, but older children may be welcome too. The times each day will be 9-2, Monday to Thursday, and 9-Noon on Friday, concluding with (we hope) a community BBQ.

To help us with this venture, we will be welcoming a team of four from the Parish of Rothesay, including Samuel Landry, Youth & Families Minister, his wife Helen, and two young people from their Youth Group. In fact, this team just concluded a successful VBS at St. Paul’s the first week of July, and we look forward to welcoming them to our churches. Samuel and his team plan to attend Sunday worship on August 7th for members of the parishes to meet. **Volunteers will be needed** to help provide lunches Monday to Thursday, and we will be looking for volunteers to help with the BBQ on Friday the 12th. **All members of the community are welcome to the BBQ!** Even those who didn’t attend or have any connection to the VBS. We are hoping to get the word out to our neighbours as well for this free community event.

A reminder! VBS is completely free to attend, so if you know any children in this age range, maybe suggest they attend this free camp at St. Mary’s! This week will involve lots of games, Bible stories, music, crafts, and food, and will be a lot of fun.

This territory is covered by the “Treaties of Peace and Friendship” which Wəlastəkwiyyik (Wolastoqiyik), Mi’kmaq, and Passamaquoddy Peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1726. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Mi’kmaq and Wəlastəkwiyyik (Wolastoqiyik) title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

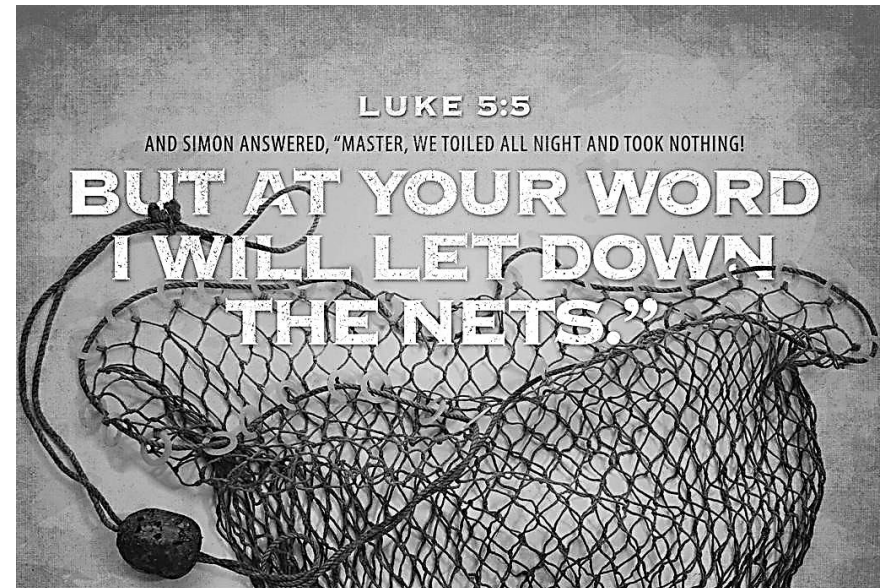
